## **WHAT TYPE OF HELP DO YOU NEED?**

**EMERGENCY** Call 911. New Jersey is a Good Samaritan state meaning no one will be prosecuted for seeking help in the event of an overdose.

**DETOX** (Detoxification) is a medically supervised process of weaning a person off addictive substance(s). Medical professionals prescribe medications and monitor the patient in a facility to ensure their safety and comfort.

**INPATIENT REHABILITATION (IP)** Individual stays in a medically supervised facility from a few days to several months depending on facility and insurance. May include Detox.

**Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP)** Recovering person lives at home or in a sober living facility, and attends a program at the facility on average 5 weekdays, for 5-7 hours each day.

**Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)** Recovering person resides at home and attends a program on average 3 days or nights/week for 3-4 hour sessions. IOP provides group and individual therapy.

**Outpatient Program (OP)** – Usually held once or twice a week. Individual counseling with some group work. Similar to traditional therapy.

**Recovery Support Services** are ongoing peer to peer support in the community i.e. Recovery Coaching.

**Halfway Houses** are transitional living spaces for people in recovery from drugs or alcohol. Also referred to as Sober or Recovery houses.

**Opioid Treatment Programs (OTP)** Medication assisted outpatient treatment for people dependent on opioids i.e. Methadone clinics.

**Self Help/12 Step Programs** Community based support groups such as 12 Step AA, NA, Alanon (for family), AlaTeen, or other pathways like SMART.
