What is the difference between

MEDICare

Medicare qualification is based on age and/or disability. Participation not subject to income

MEDICaid

Medicaid qualification is based on “need for care” and financial need. assets or “needs” test

LEVELS OF CARE

SELF-HELP/12-STEP PROGRAMS Community based such as Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, Al-Anon, or Ala Teen

OUTPATIENT TREATMENT SERVICES (OP) Provide diagnostic and outpatient treatment services, at a program site (clinics, counselor’s office, hospital) which may include prevention, intervention, screening, and assessment services. Some programs require daily attendance; others meet one or three times per week.

INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT SERVICES (IOP) Encourages participation in 12-step program; typically 3-5 days per week an average of 3-4 hours of treatment per day for a set number of sessions.

OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAMS (OTPs) Also known as methadone clinics offer medication-assisted outpatient treatment for people who are dependent on opioid drugs (such as heroin, OxyContin or Vicodin).
HALFWAY HOUSES Transitional living places for those in recovery from drugs or alcohol also referred to as “sober living house”.

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT (RTC) Provides more structure and more intensive services than out-patient treatment. Individuals live in the treatment facility; long term, typically last from 1 month to more than 1 yr.

DETOX Detox centers provide support and medical supervision during the first few hours or days of sobriety, when withdrawal can be physically overwhelming, or even dangerous. Drug detox centers follow a similar methodology as they seek to help users quit addictive substances in a professional, safe environment often accompanied by extensive counseling and therapy.

Addiction - Addiction is a chronic, often relapsing brain disease that causes compulsive drug seeking and use, despite harmful consequences to the addicted individual and to those around him or her.

Dependence – is the body’s physical need, or addiction, to a specific agent.

Detoxification (detox) - is the process of removing toxic substances that have accumulated throughout the body during the duration of substance abuse.

Assessment – is a process for defining the nature of a substance problem, determining a diagnosis, and developing specific treatment recommendations.

Screening – is a process for evaluating the possible presence of a particular problem.

Treatment Plan - a written guide to treatment that includes a person’s goals, treatment activities designed to help him/her to meet those goals, ways to tell whether a goal has been met, and a timeframe for meeting goal.

Self-Pay – to pay out of pocket for services.

Sliding fee scale – fee determined on income eligible uninsured or under-insured individuals based on annual household income.

Drug Court – addresses cases that are associated with non-violent drug related charges as an option for individuals facing a prison term. Program requires employment, intense supervision, and random and frequent drug testing and periodic court appearances.

Continuum of Care – Treatment system in which clients enter treatment at a level appropriate to their needs and then step up to more intense treatment or down to less intense treatment as needed.
